CEDAW, CSW, NGO CSW, UNWomen and the appropriation of feminism

- CEDAW adopted by the UN in 1979
- CSW Commission on the Status of Women
- NGO CSW civilian NGOs with interest in advancing women's rights
- UNWomen founded 2010
 - Should defend women's rights as set out in CEDAW
 - Has sold its soul and lost sight of its brief
 - Rich funders have prompted the move to replace sex with 'gender identity'
 - Feminism has been redefined and its language appropriated



WHRC actions

- Contacted UN representatives to warn of consequences of replacing sex with 'gender identity'
- Assumed best intentions of representatives ideology has taken hold quickly
- Idea that sex is not material but based on stereotypes does nothing to reduce women's oppression and harms women and girls
- Letters, infographics and a press release translated into multiple languages
- All resources available on our website



The results

- · GEF concluded with 'Global Acceleration Plan'
- New, appropriating language dominates funding and state actions:
 - 'Women in all their diversity'
 - 'Bodily autonomy'
 - · 'Intersectionality'
- Males/male interests must be included in work to improve women's rights
- Possible reasons for hope
